All claims must be submitted within 60 days of the completion date of the apprentice's training or attendance period. New Energy Apprenticeship Support Payment The New Energy Apprenticeships Program provides direct financial assistance to Australian Apprentices in the clean energy sector. www.dewr.gov.au/skills-support- individuals/resources/australian- apprenticeships-incentive-system- guidelines	<ul> <li>To be eligible for the New Energy Apprentice Support Payment, an apprentice must:</li> <li>have commenced or recommenced their apprenticeship with a new employer, on or after 1 January 2023 Or recommenced with the original employer if certain conditions are met;</li> <li>both the employer and Australian Apprentice complete a signed declaration, confirming the apprentice will undertake work and build their skills in the clean energy sector;</li> <li>be undertaking a Certificate III or above qualification and in an</li> </ul>	Eligible apprentices can claim up to \$10,000 for a full time apprenticeship, and up to \$5,000 for a part time apprenticeship. Eligible full time apprentices receive a payment of \$2,000 at 6, 12, 24 and 36 month points of the nominal duration of the apprenticeship, and on completion of the training contract. Eligible part-time apprentices can receive \$1,000 at 6, 12, 24 and 36 month points of the nominal duration of the apprenticeship, and on completion of the training contract. 	<ul> <li>To be eligible for the Living Away From Home Allowance, apprentices/trainees must:</li> <li>be undertaking a qualification at Certificate II level or above;</li> <li>be within 36 months of the commencement date of their apprenticeship/traineeship;</li> <li>meet the residential criteria (details can be found in Part F Payments to Australian Apprentices in the <u>Apprenticeships Incentives System Guidelines).</u></li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The Living Away From Home Allowance is paid in arrears at the following rates:</li> <li>first 12 month period from the date of commencement of the training contract - \$77.17 per week;</li> <li>second 12 month period - \$38.59 per week; and</li> <li>third 12 month period - \$25.00 per week.</li> </ul>			

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A Trade Support Loan is an interest free loan that helps apprentices to purchase trade tools and supplies required to complete their apprenticeship.	<ul> <li>To be eligible for a Trade Support Loan, an apprentice must meet the program's qualification and payability criteria:</li> <li>Qualification Criteria – the apprentice must: <ul> <li>be an Australian resident; and</li> <li>be undertaking a qualifying apprenticeship; and</li> <li>have a tax file number; and</li> <li>meet any other conditions prescribed in the Trade Support Loan Rules.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Payability Criteria – the apprentice must: <ul> <li>meet the qualification criteria; and</li> <li>be undertaking a qualifying apprenticeship for the whole of the instalment period; and</li> <li>made an application for a Trade Support Loan on or before the final day of an instalment period.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Detailed information about Trade Support Loans can be found here - www.dewr.gov.au/skills-support-individuals/trade-support-loans</li> </ul>	Eligible apprentices can borrow up to \$24,492 (2023-24), which is paid monthly in arrears. Apprentices do not have to repay the loan until they are earning an income above the minimum repayment threshold (\$51,500 for 2023-24). Once the apprentice has completed their apprenticeship, they will receive a 20% discount on the loan amount.	
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
