### Overview

Lifeguarding is currently an in-demand profession that can open up work opportunities in a variety of locations. The Pool Lifeguard Skill Set is recognised throughout Australia and in many countries around the world and will provide you with the job ready skills required for an exciting career in the aquatic and recreation industry.

You will learn how to effectively supervise aquatic venues, perform water rescues, provide first aid and respond to emergency situations. It also covers risk management, public relations, effective communication, conflict management and basic technical pool operations.

This skill set provides valuable skills for any work context as well as opportunities for career advancement roles may include Supervisor, Duty Manager, Facility Manager, Swim Teacher and Trainer/Assessor.

## Eligibility criteria

Students who meet one or more of the following eligibility requirements will be eligible for fee free (course and resource fee) training.

Eligibility requirements	Evidence of eligibility
Persons aged 15–24 years at the time of enrolment (excluding school students).	» Present current driver's license, birth certificate or similar.
Persons and dependants of persons receiving JobKeeper payments.	» A statutory declaration from an employer confirming they are in receipt of JobKeeper payments for the student.
Persons and dependants of persons receiving the Youth Allowance, AUSTUDY or ABSTUDY.	» Evidence or advice from Centrelink.
Persons and dependants of persons holding: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>» a Pensioner Concession Card;</li> <li>» a Health Care Card; or</li> <li>» a Repatriation Health Benefits Card issued by the Department of Veterans' Affairs.</li> </ul>	» Present valid card.
Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of services from the following Commonwealth support or employment services programs: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>» Jobactive;</li> <li>» Online Employment Services; or</li> <li>» ParentsNext.</li> </ul>	» A letter from the Commonwealth services provider confirming the student's participation in the program.
Dependants of persons who are inmates of a custodial institution.	» Present evidence to show that the student is the dependant of an inmate and identify the relationship between the two.

Students who do not meet one or more of the criteria listed above are able to enrol in the skill sets and pay the applicable course and resource fees in accordance with the Department of Training and Workforce Development's current Fees and Charges Policy, available at [dtwd.wa.gov.au](http://dtwd.wa.gov.au).

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
